## Clay Court Kings Race to Tennis Masters Series Monte Carlo

The Tennis Masters Series Monte Carlo always has been a favorite stop on the ATP circuit for players and fans alike. It's no wonder given the magnificent setting of the Monte Carlo Country Club, steeped in the hills of Monaco and overlooking the blue waters of the Mediterranean Sea.

Casting admiring eyes over the stars of the ATP Champions Race 2001 from the galleries can often be found Royalty from all parts of the world, as well as celebrities from the big screen and the sporting scene.

Just as the fans will line the narrow, winding streets at the harbor for the Monte Carlo Formula 1 Grand Prix in May, the latest chapter of the ATP Champions Race will provide all the same excitement, passion

and power on the famous red clay courts, graced in the past by the likes of Borg, Nastase, Lendl, Wilander and Muster.

This week also provides a major opportunity for the stars of the modern clay court game to gain some ground on Andre Agassi, the runaway leader of the ATP

Champions Race 2001 whose hot streak (22-2) and number of matches—higher than usual for Agassi through mid-April—has left him exhausted.

Among the challengers will be Gustavo Kuerten, the 2000 year-end World No. 1 and 1999 Monte Carlo champion who already has won two titles on clay this year in Buenos Aires and Acapulco. The 24-year-old from Florianopolis had his 26-match winning streak on the surface broken by

## Ferrero Wins All-Spanish Battle

ESTORIL, Portugal—Spain's Juan Carlos Ferrero moved up to 10th in the ATP Champions Race 2001 with his 7-6(3), 4-6, 6-3 win over countryman Felix Mantilla in the final of the Estoril Open.

Ferrero showed dominant form all week until he ran into Mantilla, who is making a strong comeback from shoulder surgery last August, and the 21-year-old Ferrero was delighted to win the third title of his career—and his second of 2001 (Dubai).

"I came here with a goal to win this tournament, I did it and I'm very happy," said Ferrero. "Physically, it was a [hard] match. [Mantilla] is playing so good and he is going to rise to the top again."

In an all-action tussle, the pair traded blows from the baseline for three hours before Mantilla finally succumbed. Mantilla fought back from a set and 3-1 down to take it into

final set, and with a break in his favor in the decider, he looked the more likely to win. But Ferrero received treatment to a sore shoulder and upped his game once more to prevail.

After losing his first five matches of the year, Mantilla moved onto the red clay of Europe and won an astonishing 17 matches in a row (including three in qualifying). He captured the Espinho and Barletta challenger titles, and is looking close to the form of 1998, when he reached the Roland Garros semifinals.

"I'm dead now," said an exhausted Mantilla after the final. "Ferrero is one of the three or four best players on clay and it was very tough. I wasn't used to losing [after so many wins] and it felt strange, but this was his day."

Mantilla made significant strides in the ATP Champions Race 2001 this week, jumping from 142nd to 62nd.

## Canas Captures Career First in Casablanca

CASABLANCA, Morocco—Qualifier Guillermo Canas captured his first career ATP title with a 7-5, 6-2 victory over Spain's Tommy Robredo to win the Grand Prix Hassan II.

Canas, who missed most of 2000 after undergoing surgery on his left wrist, did not drop a set in seven matches en route to becoming the second qualifier to win an ATP title in 2001 (Nicolas Escude, Rotterdam).

"I am very happy to have won my first ATP title," said the Argentine, who moves to 20th in the ATP Champions Race. "I was dreaming about it the whole time. This week I just played unbelievable [tennis]—everything was working."

Playing what he described after his semifinal win as the best tennis of his career, Canas reached his second career final (Orlando, 1999) with victories over Morocco's Mehdi

Tahiri, Jens Knippschild, Andrea Gaudenzi and two-time Roland Garros champion Sergi Bruguera, winning five of his 14 sets 6-0 (including qualifying).

Robredo had a much tougher week in reaching his first ATP final. The 18-year-old recovered from the loss of the first set against Olivier Malcor and Jiri Vanek to reach the quarterfinals, where he overcame German Puentes with the loss of only one game. In the semifinals, he upset local favorite and sixth seed Younes El Aynaoui, saving one match point to emerge a 3-6, 6-3, 7-6(4) winner and described it as "one of the best days of my life."

Unfortunately for the young Spaniard, Canas was too hot for him in the final, and after a closely-fought first set, Canas took control of the match and sealed his victory.

### DOUBLES REVIEW

## Czechs Defy All Odds

Qualifiers Radek Stepanek and Michal Tabara of the Czech Republic capped an impressive week by winning their first ATP doubles title together in Estoril, while top seeded Americans Michael Hill and Jeff Tarango captured the Grand Prix Hassan II doubles crown in Casablanca.

Playing in their first tournament of the year as a team, Stepanek and Tabara defied all odds to emerge through the qualifying draw and win the title with a 6-4, 6-2 victory over top seeds Nenad Zimonjic and Donald Johnson.

In the first round of qualifying against Spain's Salvador Navarro and Didac Perez, Stepanek and Tabara faced three match points at 3-5, 0-40 in the final set, but came back to win the match, qualify for the main draw and win the tournament.

"We saved three match points in the qualifying rounds," said Stepanek. "I can only laugh. Michal only decided to play doubles with me one minute before the deadline. We had a great week."

In Casablanca, Hill and Tarango claimed their second title as a team with a 7-6(2), 6-3 victory over second seeds Pablo Albano of Argentina and his Australian partner David Macpherson. The duo now have a 28-14 career record, adding the title to their previous win in Brighton last November.

Lleyton Hewitt during the Davis Cup tie against Australia last weekend. During that stretch, the Brazilian won the Tennis Masters Series Hamburg shield and a second Roland Garros crown, and with them became only the fifth player since 1950 to win all four major clay court titles (Monte Carlo, Rome, Hamburg and Roland Garros).

Kuerten begins his campaign for the title against Younes El Aynaoui, a semifinalist last week in Casablanca.

Should Kuerten reclaim the shield this week, he will face no shortage of experienced challengers in the 64-draw. Defending champion Cedric Pioline, who at the age of 30 years and 9 months became the oldest winner

of the Tennis Masters Series Monte Carlo tournament with a straight-set victory over Dominik Hrbaty in the final 12 months ago, opens his defense against David Prinosil on Court Centrale on Monday.

Meanwhile, former champions Carlos Moya (1998), Marcelo Rios (1997), Andrei Medvedev (1994) and two-time winner Sergi Bruguera

(1991, '93) also return to familiar territory with happy memories. Bruguera, who also reached the semifinals in Casablanca last week (l. to Guillermo Canas), faces countryman Juan Carlos Ferrero in a classic battle between the New Balls Please generation and the Established Champions. Ferrero, the 21-

year-old who has been tipped by many to be the future of Spanish tennis, won his second title of the year in Estoril last week and currently stands in 10th position in the ATP Champions Race 2001.

Other first round matches include second placed Arnaud Clement in an all-French battle with Jerome Golmard, eighth seed Tim Henman against Fabrice

Santoro in a repeat of the Ericsson Open clash, and New Balls Please star Roger Federer, the 15th seed, against former Roland Garros winner Michael Chang. Top seed Marat Safin faces Frenchman Arnaud di Pasquale in his first round match, while third seed Magnus Norman takes on Rotterdam winner Nicolas Escude, also of France.

ten] after it.”—**Tim Henman's** assessment of who will be the toughest player to face in the European clay court season's opener in Estoril. Unfortunately for Henman, his second round opponent was eventual finalist **Felix Mantilla**—of Spain.

“I didn't know anything about him. I know a lot more now.”—**Michael Chang** on Spanish qualifier **Albert Montanes** after losing 6-1, 6-3 to the 20-year-old.

On Wednesday in Casablanca, ATP Players **Sergi Bruguera**, **Alex Calatrava** and **Mariano Zabaleta** teamed up with their Moroccan colleagues **Mounir El Aarej** and **Mohammed Dakki** for the traditional Kids Day at the Grand Prix Hassan II. The popular event, always held on a Wednesday, attracted about 500 local children. In a special clinic, the youngsters enjoyed the opportunity to hit a few balls with their idols and received some useful tips of how to make it to the top.

“Some people say I look like Sergio Garcia (Spanish golfer), some say I look like Prince Charles. I wish they would say that I look like Claudia Schiffer, then I could sit down all day and make a million dollars just with my face.”—The ever-entertaining **Dominik Hrbaty** in Estoril.

### RACE TRUE TO FORM

Agassi, who has already won more than £700,000 in accumulating a 22-2 win-loss record for the year, is so far ahead in the points race that it underlines how irrelevant the year-round ranking system, in which he remains third behind Marat Safin and Gustavo Kuerten, can be in terms of current form.

### THE RACE VS ESP

Of the two hierarchies the ATP put in place 15 months ago (the Race and the one that determines the entry lists), the "technical" ranking (based on 52 weeks) is traditionally considered the more correct one by the players themselves. Reset to zero on January 1 of each year, the Race does, in effect, not reveal its full significance until the last trimester of the year, to the point of modeling itself on the other system of classification once the Masters is over. However, for the first time since January 1, 2000, the figures the computer spit out yesterday contradict this assertion. For having totally dominating the start of the 2001 season (victories at the Australian Open, Indian Wells and Miami), Andre Agassi indeed made everyone agree: Big leader of the 2001 ranking (he actually has 249 points more than Arnaud Clément,

who follows him), the American is without a doubt the best player in the world.

### FLYING HIGH

The flight from Knoxville to Memphis that bisects Tennessee lasts only a blink of an eye for a seasoned traveler like Chris Woodruff. But last year the prospect of that 40-minute, 342-mile flight left the tennis professional completely unstrung. "That seems like a long time ago," Woodruff said last month at an ATP tournament in San Jose, Calif. "Flying was something I had done enough of. In the end, it wasn't that big a deal—because I drove." Woodruff had his reasons. He had just come off this horrific stretch of travel: Melbourne, Australia to Los Angeles to Cincinnati to Knoxville, followed by a 30-hour decompression at home. Then it was off to Charlotte, N.C., to New York to Johannesburg, South Africa, to Harare, Zimbabwe, where he clinched a dramatic U.S. Davis Cup victory by defeating Wayne Black, 3-2. The return trip (Harare to London to New York to St. Louis to Knoxville) was nothing more than a blur. In all, Woodruff covered 29,253 air miles in a span of just 11 days.

Karlstad—regarding the hosting of Davis Cup ties in the next five years. As part of the deal, the cities have to be prepared to host a tie whenever the Federation requests it. If one of the cities organizes a tie, the other three have to do their best to promote that tie by organizing various PR activities. "I see this deal as something positive. The cities can start planning for the Davis Cup at an early stage, and we can exchange experiences with the organizers," said Jan Carlzon, President of the Swedish Tennis Federation.

Eusebio de Silva Ferreira, better known to soccer fans around the world as simply 'Eusebio', was watching the semifinal action at the Estoril Open. Eusebio played for Benfica, whose stadium is just down the road from the Estoril Open, for 14 years. He represented Portugal on 64 occasions at international level, scoring 41 goals in the process. In 1966 he finished as the top scorer in the World Cup finals, while in 1965 he was voted European Footballer of the Year.

## ONE TO WATCH

When Sebastien Grosjean was making his way to the grass courts of Nottingham in June of last year, thoughts of winning his first title were probably the last thing on his mind during an adventurous journey.

As all tennis players can tell you—and the journalists can back them up—travelling often throws up little surprises now and then that make you wonder about today's modern technology. And while going from Los Angeles to Sydney won't take much more than a day, the relatively short trip from Paris to Nottingham is surely just a hop over the English Channel.

Not for Grosjean. "When I was in Paris, something happened to the plane," says the 22-year-old Frenchman. "The radar was down and they had to cancel the flight. I took a train from Paris to London, and then had to take another train up to Nottingham. It took me 24 hours to get there, but I won the tournament."

Winning the title was one of the highlights of Grosjean's career. But while there seems to be a silver lining to Grosjean's travelling

adventures to Nottingham, he won't have to travel as far to get to the Tennis Masters Series Monte Carlo this week.

Born not too far away from the Principality in Marseille, Grosjean has enjoyed much success in front of his home fans of late. An integral part of France's Davis Cup success in recent years—including the winning 1999 team—Grosjean also reached the final of this year's Marseille Open before losing to an in-form Yevgeny Kafelnikov. That run also came on the back of semi-final appearances in Sydney (l. to Hewitt) and the Australian Open, where he eventually fell to his friend and countryman Arnaud Clément despite holding match points of his own in the third set.

With Grosjean and Clément both in the ATP Champions Race 2001 Top 10 Leader Board, Nicolas Escude lying on the fringe and with Milan finalist Julien Boutter not too far behind, French tennis is looking in better shape than ever as Cedric Pioline begins the defense of his Monte Carlo title.

explains Grosjean. "But it's hard to make that next step up from juniors to seniors, and there's not much time to get used to the travelling. Now [the French Federation] are doing a good job in helping to get used to that in our country."

There is also another reason for Grosjean's success—his loving wife Marie-Pierre and his two-year-old daughter Lola. "It's the best thing in my life," says Grosjean. "It's tough when I play tennis a lot, but my wife takes care of the baby. I take her on bike rides—she loves bikes. When they're here [at tournaments] it really helps me a lot."

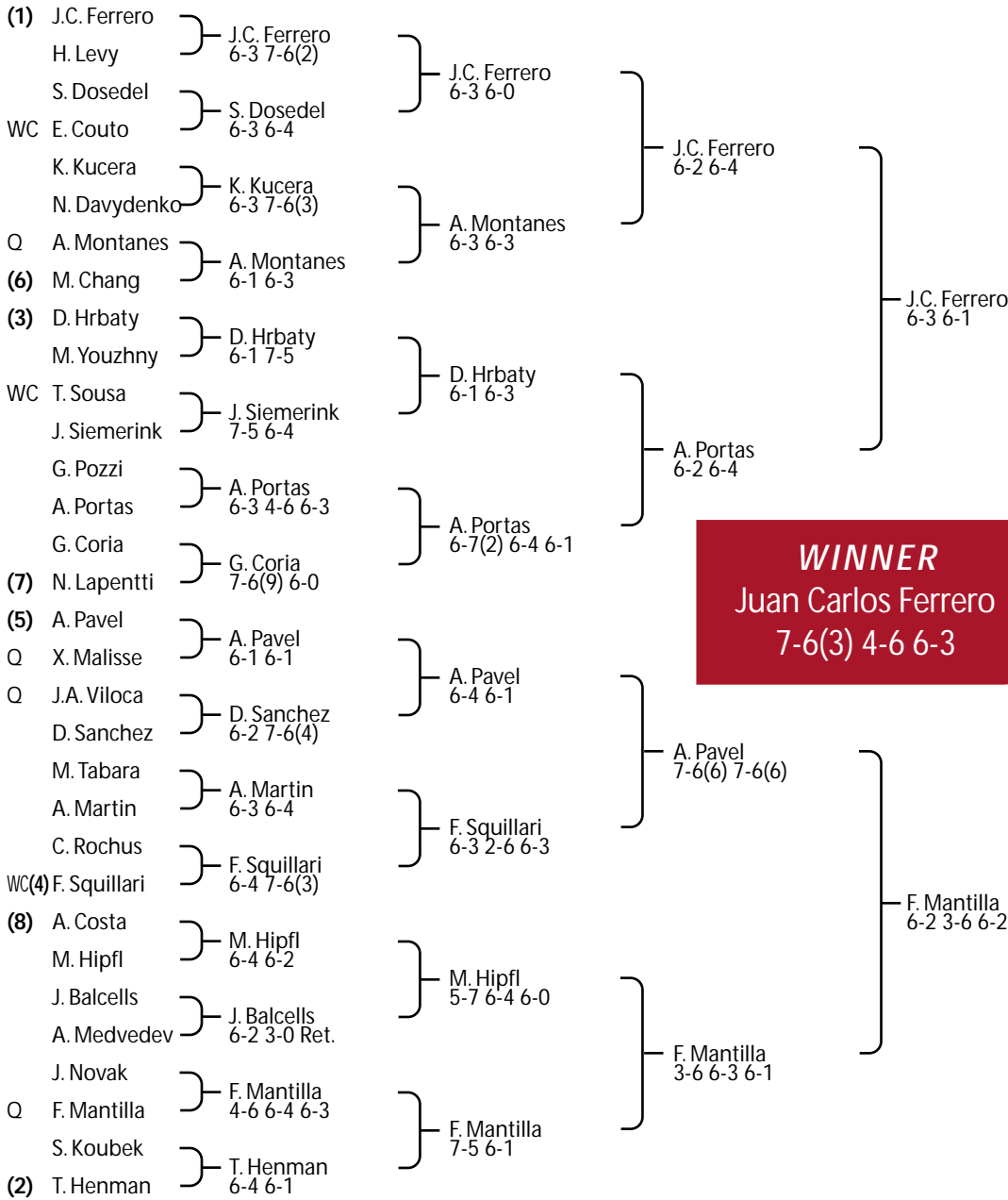

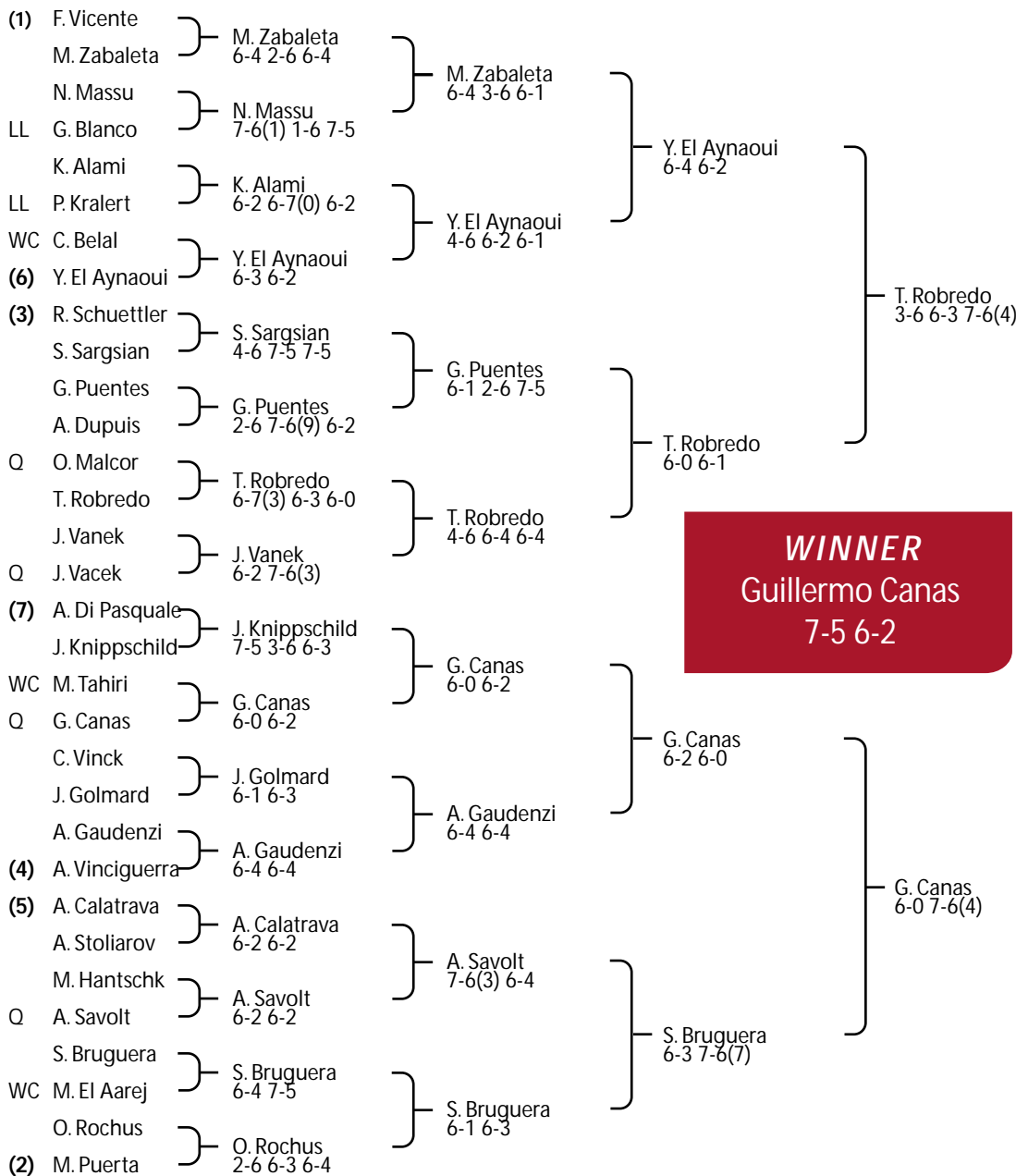
